### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course provides an opportunity for students interested in administrative law to explore topics and issues which are not covered in the introductory Administrative Law course. From four to six topics will be covered during the term. They include: the role and conduct of public inquiries; the duty to consult in aboriginal law and its relationship to procedural fairness; and comparative administrative law with an emphasis on American approaches. Other topics may include the internal life of an administrative tribunal, freedom of information legislation and Commissions, and the consolidated tribunal reforms in the U.K. and with the Administrative Tribunal of Quebec. The course will be presented through a mix of lectures and seminar discussions.
